In addition, you can receive personal assistance throughout the campaign from United Way of Grundy County staff and volunteers.

Elements of a Strong United Way Campaign

Endorsements

Your United Way campaign will be most successful when management and employees work in partnership. It is a good idea to seek endorsements from the management as well as union leaders if there is a labor group involved in your company. The materials you have been given include a sample CEO letter that can be easily adapted to your particular company and used as a payroll stuffer.

Education

Your coworkers are more likely to give if they understand the impact and value of contributing to the United Way. As part of your workplace campaign, a presentation about the importance of the United Way in our community can serve this purpose.

Call the United Way office to schedule a speaker (usually the executive director) who can speak to your employees for 5-15 minutes. Also, United Way partner agency representatives can speak briefly (but powerfully!) about the specific impact of your giving. We can put together helpful audio-visual materials such as a Power Point presentation. We can speak at regularly scheduled staff meetings or inservice sessions, or we can schedule a special gathering just for United Way. We also have brochures to distribute to employees and around your company (like break rooms).

Payroll Deduction

The key to optimum employee giving lies in payroll deduction. Payroll deduction allows employees to make meaningful contributions without facing a sudden substantial drain of cash. For the company, payroll deduction saves time and money. For the community, payroll deduction spreads giving over a large base, making it easier for more people to give more generously and take an active role in providing vital community services.

Steps to Success

1. Get to know the United Way of Grundy County

2. Plan for the Campaign

- Recruit co-workers to form a team to promote the United Way campaign. Include representation from labor groups if yours is a union shop.
- With the top management, set a giving goal that is a realistic increase from last year's giving.
- Plan a 15-minute United Way presentation during a regular employee meeting or a special event.

3. Conduct your Campaign in a Single Meeting

- Give each employee a brochure and personalized pledge card
- Include endorsement statements from the top management. Include labor leaders, if appropriate
- Hold an employee meeting or special event (or more for multishift operations) to allow the United Way to educate your fellow employees.
- Make sure there is a question and answer period
- Reduce follow-up time by asking employees to complete their pledge cards at the end of the presentation

4. Follow-up

- Contact each employee who was absent from the presentation
- Collect the employee pledge cards
- Complete the Workplace Campaign Report Workbook
- Submit pledge cards and report forms to the United Way of Grundy County
